CERVICAL HEALTH AWARENESS MONTH

January, 2015

WHEREAS, January is National Cervical Awareness Month, and affects approximately 11,000 women in the United States each year and more than 4,000 women will die, and

WHEREAS, National cervical cancer awareness month remains dedicated to increasing public knowledge about the importance of early detection of cervical cancer diagnosis and treatment; and

WHEREAS, many women still do not go for recommended pap testing and get tested for Human Papillomavirus (HPV) and,

WHEREAS , HPV is found in about 99% of cervical cancers, there are only two that are high risk and can be detected early through screening with a pelvic exam and pap test and there is a vaccine to prevent HPV infections and prevent certain cancers from HPV and;

WHEREAS, even though research indicates these are the best available methods of detection; and **prevention**, the awareness campaign is sending out several key messages, most notably, the importance of early detection through annual testing for women between the ages of 21 and 65, and

WHEREAS, cervical cancer is the second most common type of women worldwide as it develops over time, it is one of the most preventable types of cancer, and

WHEREAS, taking advantage of early detection methods will continue to decline death rates from this disease by at least 2 percent a year, and

WHEREAS, the American Cancer Society continues to search for a cure through vital research, they also work with the Office of Cancer Control and Prevention in New Jersey and support the Regional Morris and Somerset County Chronic Disease Coalition and its partners to educate our community about the importance of early detection and vaccinations our best prevention.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED that the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Somerset does hereby recognize all of the above and January 2015 as Cervical Health Awareness Month and urge all women to increase their knowledge about

cervical cancer and HPV by promoting education and early detection methods to decrease their risk for infections and cervical cancer.

January 2015 Radon Action Month

WHEREAS, radon is an odorless, tasteless and invisible gas that is released from the normal decay of the elements uranium, thorium and radium in rocks and soil and;

WHEREAS, radioactive particles from radon can damage cells that line the lungs and lead to lung cancer and;

WHEREAS, radon is the second leading cause of lung cancer in the United States and is associated with as many as 15, 000 to 22,000 lung cancer deaths a year and radon causes an estimated 500 lung cancer deaths annually in New Jersey; it is the leading cause of lung cancer in non-smokers; and,

WHEREAS, for smokers, the risk of developing lung cancer is increased dramatically if they also are exposed to excess radon and according to the Regional chronic disease and cancer coalition lung and bronchus cancers are the No. 1 cause of cancer-related deaths in Somerset County; and;

WHEREAS, radon does not cause any immediate symptoms, such as asthma or respiratory problems, testing for radon is the only way to know if a home has elevated radon levels; and;

WHEREAS, any home may have high levels of radon -- even if neighboring homes do not and pose a serious health threat to families residing in these homes and;

WHEREAS, radon testing is easy and inexpensive -- and elevated levels of radon can be effectively reduced at the cost of a typical home repair and;

WHEREAS, a significant number of homes in Somerset County have elevated levels of radon therefore health authorities recommend testing and encourage corrective action when necessary and;

WHEREAS, taking this action and reducing exposure to tobacco and second hand smoke, lives can be saved.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Somerset County Board of Chosen Freeholders, to help save lives and raise awareness of radon and lung cancer, does hereby proclaim the month of January 2015 as Radon Action Month and call upon all residents who have not yet tested, to test their homes for radon, and to reduce radon levels if elevated levels are found, to protect their families from the serious health risk of radon and to educate yourselves, families and friends on the benefits of quitting smoking and reducing the risk of second hand smoke and radon exposure.

PUBLIC PORTION

John Anderson, Jersey Central Power and Light, advised the Board that JCP&L has restarted its Power Systems Institute, a training program at Raritan Valley Community College and Brookdale Community College. The program has space for 44 students who will start their education in fall 2015 for a possible career as a line worker or substation worker at JCP&L.

Students will learn topics and skills such as electrical theory, mathematical calculations, how to climb utility poles and put up crossarms, how to run wire or test a transformer and how to repair electric network equipment. Students who graduate from the program, will have an associate's degree in applied science with a focus on electric utility technology, and a position with JCP&L that has a starting salary of about \$50,000.

In order to finance the cost of the Improvements not covered by the application of the Down Payment, negotiable bonds of the County are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$5,670,313.00 pursuant to the provisions of the Local Bond Law (the "Bonds"). In anticipation of the issuance of the Bonds and to temporarily finance said improvements or purposes, negotiable bond anticipation notes of the County are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount not exceeding \$5,670,313.00 pursuant to the provisions of the Local Bond Law (the "Bond Anticipation Notes" or "Notes").

The Improvements authorized and the purposes for which obligations are to be issued hereunder, the estimated cost of each Improvement, the appropriation therefore and the estimated maximum amount of Bonds or Notes to be issued for each Improvement are as set forth in Exhibit I attached hereto.

The estimated maximum amount of Bonds or Notes to be issued for the purpose of financing a portion of the cost of the Improvements is \$5,670,313.00.

The estimated cost of the improvements is \$5,968,750.00, which amount represents the initial appropriation made by the County. The excess of the appropriations made for each of the Improvements over the estimated maximum amount of Bonds or Notes authorized to be issued therefore is the Down Payment.

All Bond Anticipation Notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer of the County (the "Chief Financial Officer"); provided that no Note shall mature later than one year from its date. The Notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer. The Chief Financial Officer shall determine all matters in connection with Notes issued pursuant to this ordinance, and the signature of the Chief Financial Officer upon the Notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All Notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of Section 8(a) of the Local Bond Law. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the Notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The Chief Financial Officer is directed to report in writing to the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the Notes pursuant to this ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the Notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

The capital budget of the County is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. The resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, Department of Community Affairs, State of New Jersey is on file with the Deputy Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders and is available for public inspection.

The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

The Improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are not current expenses, and are capital improvements or properties that the County may lawfully make or acquire as general improvements, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.

The average period of usefulness of the Improvements, within the limitations of the Local Bond Law, taking into consideration the respective amounts of all obligations authorized for the several purposes, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the Bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is 10 years.

The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed with the Deputy Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director, Division of Local Government Services, Department of Community Affairs, State of New Jersey. Such statement shows that the gross debt of the County, as defined in the Local Bond Law, is increased by the authorization of Bonds and Notes provided in this bond ordinance by \$5,670,313.00 and the obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

An aggregate amount not exceeding \$1,500,000.00 for items of expense listed in and permitted under Section 20 of the Local Bond Law is included in the estimated cost of the Improvements, as indicated herein.

Any funds received from time to time by the County as contributions in aid of financing the purposes described in Section 3 of this Ordinance shall be used for financing said Improvements by application thereof either to direct payment of the cost of said Improvements or to the payment or reduction of the authorization of the obligations of the County authorized therefore by this Bond Ordinance. Any such funds received may, and all such funds so received which are not required for direct payment of the cost of said Improvements shall, be held and applied by the County as funds applicable only to the payment of obligations of the County authorized by this Bond Ordinance.

The full faith and credit of the County are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the County, and the County shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property within the County for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

This Bond Ordinance constitutes a declaration of official intent under Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2. The County reasonably expects to pay expenditures with respect to the Improvements prior to the date that County incurs debt obligations under this Bond Ordinance. The County reasonable expects to reimburse such expenditures with the proceeds of debt to be incurred by the County under this Bond Ordinance. The maximum principal amount of debt expected to be issued for payment of the costs of the Improvements is \$5,670,313.00.

This bond ordinance shall take effect 20 days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.
