WHEREAS, the public awareness campaign strives to increase knowledge about this disease, it recognizes the best defense against ovarian cancer is early detection, therefore it is essential that women know the risk factors associated with the disease; and

WHEREAS, this month is dedicated to prevention and awareness, it is also to honor those we have lost, show our support for women who bravely carry on the fight, and take action to lessen the tragic toll ovarian cancer takes on families across our county; and

PROSTATE CANCER AWARENESS MONTH  
SEPTEMBER 2015

WHEREAS, Cancer is a disease in which cells in the body grow out of control. When cancer starts in the prostate, it is called prostate cancer. Except for skin cancer, prostate cancer is the most common cancer in American men. It is the second most common cause of death from cancer among white, African American, American Indian/Alaska Native, and Hispanic men, and the fourth most common cause of death from cancer among Asian/Pacific Islander men. Those affected are fathers, brothers, and sons -- and this year, more than 230,000 of them are expected to be diagnosed with this disease; and

WHEREAS, Most prostate cancers grow slowly, and do not cause any health problems in men who have them. Many men with prostate cancer—especially those with tumors that have not spread beyond the prostate—die of other causes without ever having any symptoms from the cancer; and

WHEREAS, A prostate specific antigen (PSA) test may find a prostate health problem, but treatment can cause serious side effects. Learn about prostate cancer and talk to your doctor before you decide to get tested or treated for prostate cancer; and

WHEREAS, Since the mid-1990s, the mortality rate for prostate cancer has fallen, but too many men -- an estimated 29,000 this year -- will die from this disease, and even more are at risk. Increased awareness can help these men make informed choices about their health. While the exact causes of prostate cancer remain unknown, medical research has identified well-established risk factors with which men should be familiar, including age, family history, and race. We encourage all men, especially those at higher risk, to talk with their doctors about how prostate cancer could affect them; and

WHEREAS, this month is dedicated to prevention and awareness, it is also to honor those we have lost, showing our support for patients who continue to battle this cancer each day and the families who stand by their side; and

RARITAN REAL ESTATE, LLC AND THE COUNTY OF SOMERSET

WHEREAS, Raritan Real Estate, LLC (“Developer”), whose address is c/o The Law Office of Marcia Polgar Zalewski, Esq., 64 North Bridge Street, Somerville, NJ 08876 is razing an existing fast food restaurant and detached single family home to construct a two-story building for a 2,501 square foot fast food restaurant with drive thru (Tim Horton’s and Coldstone Creamery) on the first floor and 1,492 square foot office space on the second floor on property identified as Block 30, Lots 2 and 3 on the tax map of Raritan Borough, and on file with the County Planning Board as RT 122-S; and

WHEREAS, the Developer has applied to the Somerset County Planning Board for approval of the project; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that this project is located within the boundaries of the Somerset Regional Center Traffic Study area, which study requires developers within such area to make appropriate pro rata contributions for infrastructure improvements therein; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Board has determined, utilizing the Somerset Regional Center Traffic Study prepared by Garmin Associates (the “study”), that the project will generate certain traffic impacts upon the roads and intersections adjacent to and in the area of the subject property; and

WHEREAS, the Developer agrees that certain off-tract road improvements are necessary to mitigate such traffic impacts and that such improvements bear a rational nexus to the project; and

WHEREAS, based on the application of the principles of the aforesaid study to the instant application, the County Planning Board has determined this project's Regional Center obligation to be three thousand five hundred ninety-four dollars and 00/100 dollars (\$3,594.00). This amount represents this project's fair share contribution towards the cost of improvements within the study area; and

WHEREAS, the Developer has paid the required obligation in the amount of \$3,594.00 which was determined utilizing the aforementioned study; and

WHEREAS, the Somerset County Planning Board conceptually approved the Development Agreement on file with the Deputy Clerk of the Board at its August 18, 2015 meeting and forwarded same to the Somerset County Board of Chosen Freeholders for execution.

WHEREAS, the contract was awarded as a Professional Service Contract in accordance with 40A: 11-5 (1)(a) of the Local Public Contracts Law on July 9, 2013; and

WHEREAS, RBA Group, Inc., 7 Campus Drive, Suite 300, Parsippany, NJ 07054-4495 has submitted a Consultant Agreement Modification No. 2 For Additional Engineering Services; and

Additionally, if the fulfillment of any of the terms and provisions of this Agreement is delayed or prevented by any court order, or action or injunction or other such agreement, this Agreement shall become voidable by the County of Somerset by notice to each party.
