One of the store owners seemed really happy that we came and gave him the information packets which contained information such as age-of-sale and checking ID. This is someone who definitely does not want to get into any legal trouble. I think the most surprising moment of the night was that a pizzeria was one of the seven stores that sold tobacco products. Overall, the experience was great! This is something I would do definitely do again.
