- Part the curtains and exit the voting booth.

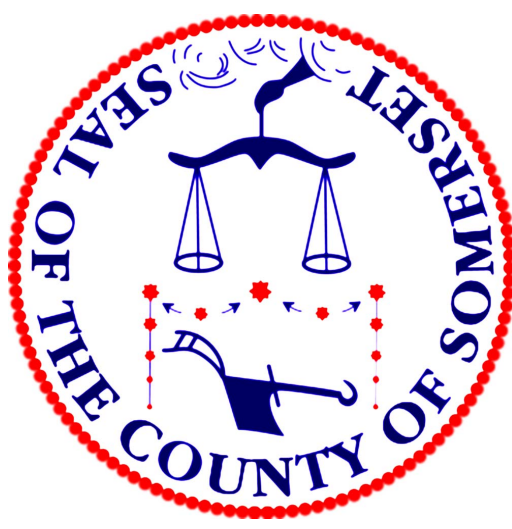
