What is the *Somerset County Preservation Plan*?

- An innovative document that will effectively:
 - Update the 2008 Somerset County Comprehensive Farmland Preservation Plan
 - Update the 2001 Somerset County Open Space and Recreation Plan
 - Create a Historic Preservation Plan
- Identification of opportunities and strategies for duality of uses and leveraging of funds
- Usage of the common themes of tourism and economics to link the elements together
- Advances the Somerset County Investment Framework

What is the format of the Plan?

- Each element will be able to stand on its own, while being linked to the other elements
- Recommendations and strategies will be cross-referenced
- Opportunities for the use of two or more programs will be promoted when possible








How is the Plan being supervised?

- Professional staff from Planning and Engineering Divisions, Cultural and Heritage and Parks are working together to organize the project and oversee the Consultant Team
- Steering Committee of 13 preservation experts has been assembled and will oversee policy and issues related to the larger Plan
- The SCADB will oversee the Farmland Preservation Element
- OSAC and Park Commission will oversee the Open Space Preservation and Recreation Element
- Cultural and Heritage Commission will oversee the Historic Preservation Element
- Final Plan will be adopted by the Planning Board as an element of the Somerset County Master Plan

 - Somerset County Park Commission
 - Somerset County Open Space Advisory Committee
 - Somerset County Cultural and Heritage Commission
- All comments from Public Meetings and interactions with governing bodies will be reviewed and implemented as determined by Staff and the Steering Committee
- Public Outreach is a main focus of the Plan extensive advertising and opportunities for comments will be a priority!

Building Upon Existing Planning Initiatives

- The Plan will incorporate and build upon the Somerset County Investment Framework, Wastewater Management Plan and updated Hazard Mitigation Plan
- The Plan will tie together the three primary preservation programs under the County umbrella, allowing for sounder and more sustainable planning
- Recent allocation from Corporate Business Tax funding will be stable but smaller – the Plan will identify leveraging opportunities in advance

Current Schedule

- First meeting of the Steering Committee was held in November – A number of site inspections have taken place across the County
- Surveys are being distributed to Open Space Coordinators and Recreation Directors to seek input on existing resources and future needs
- Surveys are being distributed to municipalities to ascertain existing historic preservation planning and zoning efforts
- First Public Meeting held on January 30, 2018 opportunity to shape the Plan and provide valuable input
- Steering Committees meetings will be held in February
