4. If an error on the write-in is made - before you press "enter" on the write-in keypad - press the arrow key to the left until the error is cleared and then re-type the name. To make a space, press the arrow key to the right. After you have completed voting the entire ballot, press the orange "cast vote" button located on your lower right-hand side.
