

 The goal of the plan is to identify projects that can reduce damages from future natural hazards. The primary hazard in Somerset County is flooding, but other potential hazards that were analyzed included drought, extreme cold, extreme heat, snow, ice, hall, windstorms and tornadoes, among others. The plan allows the county and its participating municipalities to be eligible for future mitigation funding from FEMA. It addresses a variety of potential natural hazards that could affect some or all of our residents. Federal regulations (44 CFR 201.6.d.3) requires that local hazard mitigation plans be reviewed, revised as appropriate, and resubmitted for approval on a five year cycle from the date of initial plan adoption in order to remain eligible for benefits as under DMA 2000. 



Figure C-3. Screenshot of the 'Hazard Mitigation Plan' Link on the Somerset County Government Website





Figure C-5. Screenshot of the 'Public Comments' Link on the Somerset County Government Website



# Somerset County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan Update



Natural hazards are a part of life throughout Somerset County. All of these hazard events have the potential to cause property loss, economic hardship, environmental degradation and threats to public health and safety including loss of life. An important part of emergency management involves hazard mitigation

planning aimed at minimizing these impacts and improving resiliency. The Plan describes the hazard risks that can occur, identifies vulnerable community assets, and presents mitigation strategies comprised of actions and projects that will be implemented to reduce key hazard risks.

#### **Background and Purpose**

The Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan for Somerset County meets the requirements of the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 (or "DMA 2000") and allows for potential future Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) funding opportunities for participating jurisdictions. Its development was led by the County, and planning costs were off-set by a FEMA planning grant. The County opted to use what FEMA calls a "multi-jurisdictional" approach as a form of municipal "shared service", meaning that instead of just being a plan for the County government, every municipality participated as an equal partner. As such, the plan includes individual municipal HMP Annexes that


