38		as submitted, however, an appended contract for inspection services remains to be
39		approved by the Borough of Bound Brook Council before the application can be approved
40		through the Division of Taxation.

42	2.	Administrator Vance discussed the status of tax rate certifications with the commissioners.
43		Rates for all districts with the exception of Bridgewater should be available for certification
44		during the month of July, with the possible exception of the Township of Bridgewater.
45		Bridgewater has not yet prepared its municipal budget for the current year and their tax
46		rate would be delayed until this is accomplished, and the DLGS in DCA has reviewed and
47		approved it.

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## NEW BUSINESS, cont'd:

3. Administrator Vance submitted tables he prepared which reported the total of all tax deductions, including senior citizens, disabled citizens and eligible veterans, which he prepares annually from records provided by the local tax collectors in each of our 21 municipalities. These tables provide confirmation of the total amounts to be reimbursed by the State of New Jersey to cover the costs of these tax deductions. The administrator asked the commissioners to approve and sign the document, which would then be forwarded to the Division of Taxation.

4. Administrator Vance announced that the NJACTB Cape May educational conference for 2019, to be held in Cape May, would include a program addressing the recent tax court decision in Verizon v. Hopewell Borough, Mercer County. The case has implications for virtually every municipality in this state and he encouraged assessors and commissioners to attend if possible. This conference will begin on Monday August 26<sup>th</sup> and end on Friday, August 30<sup>th</sup>.

5. The administrator and deputy administrator reported on the just-completed appeal season, which addressed a total of 424 tax appeals, the lowest number of the last decade for Somerset County. The administrator reviewed all cases heard since the previous tax board meeting, including those heard during the period from June 10<sup>th</sup> through June 25<sup>th</sup>, in which the commissioners were required to make a determination of value, other than for stipulated or withdrawn appeals, or cases affirmed to advance to the tax court. The commissioners reviewed the information for each municipality and voted to finalize value conclusions for each town in which such matters were presented and heard.

6. The 2019 State Equalization Table was presented by the administrator. This table reports on the county-wide equalization ratios and equalized values for all 21 counties in New Jersey. The information is provided by the Division of Taxation and reported without comment as it requires no action by the commissioners.

7. Administrator Vance provided a brief report on the annual AMANJ state wide conference as held at the Sea View Country Club in Galloway Township beginning on June 26<sup>th</sup> and ending on June 28<sup>th</sup>. He reported the conference was well run and that the venue was very attractive. Several assessors from Somerset County also attended.

8. Administrator Vance and a group of assessors present commented briefly on a meeting held that morning with BRT technologies, who presented their program of assessment services, including MODIV and CAMA, to the panel of assessors in Somerset County. The programs looked promising and would be considered further by the Somerset County Assessors.
