

CREATIVE WRITING WORKSHOPS, continued

Songwriting Mimi Cross

Workshop Location: Hunterdon Building, Room H-120 Workshop Time: 9:45 – 10:45 11:45 – 12:45

This workshop is for musicians and non-musicians alike! All participants will be encouraged and supported as we focus on lyrics, melody, chord progression, and mood. We'll listen to songs, analyze structure, and use literary devices to create original lyrics. We'll use our voices to facilitate the process. Participants work individually and as part of a group. Prior musical experience is not necessary!

Workshop Location: Hunterdon Building, Room H-120

Workshop Time: 1:00 – 2:00

Story Scan is for anyone interested in finding story, as well as relaxation, through meditation and writing! This class begins with breath work and centering suggestions followed by a guided 20-minute deep relaxation meditation. In this state of relaxation and body awareness, participants will learn how to sense blocks within the body through a technique known as scanning. After the body scan, class members will be led from relaxation to writing with the idea of transforming blocks into stories. Learn how tension, tightness, or holding in your body can translate into treasure. Sharing and discussion will follow if time allows. No previous experience with writing or yoga is necessary!
