SOMERSET COUNTY BOARD OF TAXATION 1 27 Warren Street, 4th Floor 2 3 Somerville, NJ 4 5 MINUTES OF THE MEETING 6 July 14th, 2020 – Regular Meeting 7 8 The July regular monthly meeting of the Somerset County Board of Taxation for 2020 was held via the internet, using the Zoom platform, on July 14th, 2020 starting at 12:25 PM. The meeting had been 9 advertised in accordance with State Law; upon roll call, President Eader, Vice President Goldberg and 10 11 Commissioners Jordan, Linnus and Rosen were attending. Tax Administrator Robert Vance hosted the 12 meeting on line and Deputy Tax Administrator Dawn Guttschall was also attending. The start time for 13 this meeting was delayed due to technical issues with the internet and the computers. The following 14 matters were discussed. 15 16 MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING 17 The minutes of the June 9th regular meeting of the Board of Taxation were submitted by the 18 19 administrator to the commissioners for their approval. Approval of the minutes was moved by Vice 20 President Goldberg Rosen and seconded by Commissioner Rosen. The roll was called and the minutes 21 for that meeting were approved by all 5 commissioners. 22 23 CORRESPONDENCE: 24 25 None received. 26 27 **OLD BUSINESS:** 28 29 1. The current balance In the Trust Account was reported to be approximately \$464,569. 30 **NEW BUSINESS:** 31 32 33 1. The Local Property Tax Department of the Division of Taxation in the Department of the 34 Treasury has decided that the traditional AFR-A form, used by all annually reassessing 35 districts in NJ, is not going to be acceptable in 2020 due to recent litigation at the NJ Tax Court. All annually reassessing districts have been asked to submit, or re-submit, their 36 37 applications using the older AFR form. The assessors must modify the manner in which it is 38 completed to meet State specifications. This advice has been sent to all assessors and the applications should be arriving at the tax board offices shortly; the deadline for board 39 40 approval and submission to the State is August 1st. 41 42 2. Tax Rates were being struck as soon as certifications of budgets were received from the 43 DLGS in DCA. To date, 11 had been received, another 10 are expected over the next few 44 weeks, assuming all municipal budgets do receive final approval. 45

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NEW BUSINESS (Cont'd)

- 3. Administrator Vance reported that the summaries of deductions for veterans and senior citizens had been completed and were ready for the signatures of the commissioners. It was agreed that these forms would be circulated electronically to all commissioners. He explained that the summary is the basis for the State's reimbursement of all districts for the cost of these deductions, which total over \$3,500,000 in Somerset County.
- 4. The only educational opportunity remaining on the 2020 calendar as of this date is the NJACTB annual educational conference at Cape May. The administrator indicated that he thought it would be a bad idea to go forward with this week long conference, but that in discussions with other members of the Education Committee, there were some members who still wanted this program to proceed as scheduled. The commissioners were polled on this and all agreed that the administrator should send a letter to the committee expressing their unanimous recommendation that this session be cancelled for this year, due to the ongoing COVID19 pandemic.
- 5. After a brief review of the final appeals per week report, discussion concerning the upcoming appeal season was opened by the administrator. It remained a possibility that appeals would have to be heard using the internet, probably on the same Zoom platform that we are using for our board meetings.
- 6. Administrator Vance told the commissioners that the building at 27 Warren Street, where the tax board offices are located, opened for access to employees only on July 13th. The opening of county buildings to be public was expected to occur at some point in the middle of August, but he exact date was not yet determined.

As the July meeting of the Board of Taxation was held on-line, there was no public portion at the end of the regular meeting, which occurred at 1 PM. The next scheduled meeting of the Board of Taxation will be on July 14th and may again be held on-line, using the Zoom platform, should the COVID 19 pandemic continue to restrict access to the county facilities.
