This is not an official Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM). This map shows the most current GIS data representing the Flood Hazard Areas (FHAs) mapped by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) in accordance with Section 2(b) (4) of the Flood Disaster Protection Act of 1973. Special Flood Hazard Areas (SFHA) are identified on the FEMA Flood Insurance Rate Map as areas that will be inundated by the flood event that has a 1% chance of being equaled or exceeded in any given year. This 1% annual chance flood is also referred to as the 100-year flood and represents the land area covered by the floodwaters of the base flood. The SFHA is the regulatory floodway where National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) flood insurance is needed to comply with NFIP regulations. FEMA Flood Insurance Rate Maps also indicate areas of moderate flood risk, such as areas with 0.2% annual chance flood or areas with reduced risk due to levee. No base flood elevations or depths are shown in these zones, and insurance purchase is not required. Flood Hazard Areas, together with other environmental factors and local and regional plans and studies were taken into consideration when delineating the Assigned Sewer Service Areas shown on WMP Maps 3.A and 3.B.

Development in Special Flood Hazard Areas may be subject to restrictions under Federal, State and/or municipal statutes, rules, ordinances, rules, and/or construction codes. Interested persons should check with FEMA and municipal floodplain managers for the latest information on rules, regulations and best practices.
