#### **COVID-19 Vaccination**

Everyone who lives, works, or studies in New Jersey, ages 5+ are eligible to be vaccinated. At this time, only the Pfizer vaccine is authorized for individuals 5-17. Minors must be accompanied by an adult and have parent/guardian consent. Individuals must be 18 years or older to receive the Moderna and Johnson & Johnson vaccine.

Everyone interested in receiving the COVID-19 vaccine at a Somerset County vaccination clinic, can register in the New Jersey Vaccination Registration System (NJVSS) at: <a href="https://covidvaccine.nj.gov/">https://covidvaccine.nj.gov/</a>. ppointments are strongly encouraged, however, walk-ins will be accepted.

Third (additional) doses of Pfizer and Moderna COVID-19 vaccines are currently only available for moderately or severely immunocompromised individuals. Booster doses of the Pfizer-BioNTech and Moderna COVID-19 vaccines are currently being offered to certain eligible populations who have completed their primary series at least six (6) or more months ago. Johnson & Johnson COVID-19 booster doses are available to individuals 18 years and older who have completed their initial vaccination at least 2 months ago.
