- ★ The Sourland Region has a rich history! During the American Revolution, Sourland Mountain was an important vantage point for American army scouts because of its high elevations!
- ★ Between 1821 and 1850, Sourland Mountain provided hiding places and safety for those traveling on the Underground Railroad!
- ★ From the 1860s to the early 1900s, the Sourlands supported a thriving peach industry.
- ★ You can visit the Mount Zion African Methodist Episcopal church that still stands on Hollow Road! Today, it is called the Stoutsburg Sourland African American Museum.
