I. Call Meeting to Order & Introductions

Tim Wolf called the meeting to order at 1:32 PM. A quorum was established.

II. Approval of the May 24, 2023, Minutes

Motion to approve the May 2023, meeting minutes was made by Monica Mulligan and seconded by Michele Boronkas. One abstention was made by Mary Jane Dipaolo. Motion carried.

III. Presentation – NJ ALICE Report on COVID-19 Impact: Joanne Hala, Community Impact & Grants-United Way of Northern New Jersey

- Most of the data is taken from the American Community Survey from 2019-2021.
- The initial question the research was trying to answer, "Why are we helping people but never getting anywhere".
- ALICE is an acronym for Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed
- United for ALICE was founded and powered by United Way of Northern New Jersey
- This is a measure different than the federal poverty level.
- The data looks at the household survival budget: the bare-minimum costs of basic necessities (housing, childcare, food, transportation, health care, and a smartphone plan).
 - o This budget is the basis for determining whether households are above or below the ALICE threshold by county.
- Cost of living varies across New Jersey.
 - O The annual total for the Household Survival Budget for a family of four with two adults, an infant and a preschooler ranged from \$66,876 in Camden County to \$101,976 in Somerset County.
- Competing force in 2021 included:
 - o Inflation
 - o Job disruption
 - o Pandemic assistance
- Households below the ALICE threshold:

- 2019: 1,135,4202021:1,292,430
- Demographics, Highest % Hardship
 - o Black (52%) and Hispanic (51%)
 - o Under 25 (69%) and 65+ (49%)
 - o Single-parent (71% female; 54% male)
- Respondents below ALICE Threshold
 - o 26% not have enough food
 - o 29% of renters behind ion rent
 - o 25% nervous, anxious or on edge
- Next Steps
 - o Dig into national, state, and local data (county, ZIP code, etc.) on UnitedForALICE.org
 - o See ALICE data by Legislative District and connect to your state and federal representatives
 - o Connect with United Way of Northern NJ for support and volunteer opportunities
 - O Use the ALICE in Action Database to learn more about the programs, practices, and policies that are partners are implementing to make a difference for ALICE households. And submit your actions!

- The Somerset Helps Mobile Outreach Van is moving forward. An email will be sent this week explaining procedures with a link to our website.
- Crisis Intervention Training (CIT) formal 40-hr curriculum for municipal law enforcement was held June 19-June 23. 23 officers and 3 mental health professionals graduated. Somerset is the final county to adopt the program.

- The search for the Community Police Alliance Coordinator in Bound Brook has been slow. It is important for candidates to be licensed and bilingual.
- The 2023 budget was passed on June 27th.
- The New Jersey Division of Consumer Affairs ("DCA"), welcomes you to join DCA's Social Work outreach program: New Jersey Social Work Licensure: You've got questions, we've got answers. As you may recall, this is the promised follow up to the discussion Mary Jane, Somerset County HSAC Chair and Mike Frost, SCDHS Director had with DCA Deputy Director Howard Pine and DCA Director Cari Fais a few weeks back at the behest of the Somerset County HSAC based on reported concerns about delays in LSW/LCSW licensing and process questions that were attached to that. On July 10th at 2:30 p.m., DCA will screen a presentation that acts as an orientation for the licensure process. Following the presentation, attendees will be invited to pose questions to the Executive Director of the licensing Board. Topics discussed will include licensure, renewal, educational requirements, and more! This is an opportunity to engage directly with the licensing Board to help demystify the licensure process and to get an overview of the Board's mission for the profession and the public.
