## NOTICE OF ADOPTED ORDINANCE

The ordinance, published herein, was introduced and passed on first reading on January 11, and adopted by the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Somerset, New Jersey, on February 13, 2024 at its regularly scheduled meeting in the Somerset County Administration Building in the Borough of Somerville County of Somerset and State of New Jersey, after a public hearing was held.

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING SPEED LIMIT ALONG BONNIE BURN ROAD COUNTY ROUTE 695, WATCHUNG BOROUGH, SOMERSET COUNTY, NEW JERSEY

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of County Commissioners, for the County of Somerset that;

SECTION I. Speed limits for both directions of traffic along Bonnie Burn Road, County

Route 695, in Borough of Watchung shall be established as follows;

ZONE 1. 25 MPH from State Route 22 Vally Road.

SECTION II. Regulatory and Warning signs, conforming to the current Manual on

Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways, shall be

erected and maintained to effect the above-designated speed limits.

SECTION III. This ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication as

required by law and upon approval by the Somerset County Engineer.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that all previous ordinances or resolutions establishing speed limits on the aforementioned roadway(s) or portions of the roadway(s) herein described are hereby repealed.
