I. Call Meeting to Order & Introductions

Tim Wolf called the meeting to order at 1:33 PM. A quorum was established.

II. Approval of the May 22, 2024, Minutes

Motion to approve the May 2024 meeting minutes was made by Steve Nagel and seconded by Diann Robinson. Motion carried.

III. State and County Agency Reports

Department of Human Services (DHS) - Nelson Troche

• As part of a continued effort to improve and expand the home and community-based services workforce, the Department of Human Services, Department of Children and Families, and the Higher Education Student Assistance Authority announced a new student loan redemption program to benefit health care, behavioral health, and social services professionals serving those with medical needs, behavioral and/or mental health conditions, and disabilities. Under the new Home and Community-Based Services Provider Loan Redemption Program, eligible workers can receive up to \$50,000 in loan relief in exchange for one year of service at an approved home- and community-based services provider agency or as a self-directed employee. Provider agencies are encouraged to share information about this program with all eligible employees prior to July 1, when applications will open for a 30-day period. Eligible program participants who submit a complete and accurate application will be selected by October 1 on a first-come, first-serve basis. Department of Children and Families (DCF) - Emailed by Rick Hager

- The Summer EBT is a new federal program that will provide \$40/month to all children that qualify for free/reduced-price meals every summer month that schools are closed (\$120 for the summer). In NJ, we will be using data captured on school meal applications (or household surveys for CEP districts) to directly certify as many children as possible and cards will be sent out starting in June with all \$120 loaded onto the card. - NJDCF has launched a new webpage for our "Family Connects NJ" (home visiting program for parents of newborns). The website is here: Family Connects NJ Note that this is initially starting in five counties: Essex, Middlesex, Mercer, Gloucester and Cumberland. (For the counties that are not yet active, there is still a link that will get the parent to the "Connecting NJ Hub", which does provide resources for all counties.) On the Family Connects NJ webpage, in addition to the links at the top of the page, there are five informational topics in the scrolling banner. These are: "Birth Families" (the benefits of participating in the program, including a Q&A and Fact Sheet), "Adoptive Parents and Resource Families" (the programmatic benefits for these parents, including a Q&A), "Bereaved Families" (Stillborn or recent death of newborn I including a Q&A), "Doctors/Clinicians" (includes a fact sheet for medical practitioners and a Q&A), "Registered Nurses" (includes a fact sheet and a Q&A). Note that Somerset County will be active in January 2025.
- - o Children and youth with complex behavioral health, developmental and medical needs
 - o Adolescent youth ages 13-17
 - o Sibling Groups of 4 or more
 - NJ children and youth cleared for adoption
 *NJ children and youth who are currently cleared for adoption have unique needs and include characteristics of the other 3 specialized populations described above

 - o Luann Dias shared her agency is getting a lot of calls about different types of grief not just attributed to loss of life.
 - o Stephanie Billitz recommended contacting Imagine NJ or Good Grief for a presentation.

VI. Agency Highlights/Announcements

- LuAnn Dias- Catholic Charities was awarded a DCF grant for their new program called Exchange Parent Aid Services. Will be using an evidenced based model for strength-based parenting and support services.
- Jen Guyette- the new allocation for HSAC for July 1, 2025 June 30, 2025. The contract has stayed the same. The amount is \$69,949 which goes to salary and fringe.
- James Parauda- Tri County CMO is having their annual picnic this Friday, June 29th at Forest Lodge. 600+ families have registered.
- Brenda Ward- Big Brothers Big Sisters of Coastal and Northern New Jersey recently wrapped up their school-based programs serving 71 elementary and middle school students with 56 high schoolers serving as mentors. The focus will be on the community-based program serving 21 students in Somerset County. There are adult mentors ready and available for any youth in need of a mentor.
- Camp Dragonfly is a week-long camp hosted at Somerset Hills YMCA Day Camp and is provided complimentary to children who have experienced trauma, grief, or loss in the past 14 months. For enrollment or for more information contact Eddie Norgard at enorgard@gscymca.org.
