

- LEPCs must develop an off-site Emergency Response Plan (ERP) to indicate processes / guidelines for the community's response to chemical emergencies.
  - Off-site ERPs discuss roles, responsibilities, and organizational relationships not necessarily tactics
  - Off-site ERP publicly available via a secure reading-room only. No electronics or recording devices.
- Establishment of LEPC Districts
  - NJ State Emergency Response Commission (SERC) designated Somerset County as an emergency planning district on 10/27/2023.
- Finalize off-site ERP approval & provide to NJ SERC in April 2024
  - Collect information & update ERP document as needed



- Will have an updated map the next meeting in 2025 with new facility information on it
- Procedures for information submissions & public request for ERP review:
  - Facility On-site plans & chemical inventories shall still be submitted pursuant to EPCRA & NJDEP / NJDOH requirements (Local PD, FD, OEM, etc.) & via: LEPC@co.somerset.nj.us
    - Facility on-site plans are not subject to public review
- Public request for ERP review:
  - Submit an OPRA request via Somerset County OPRA Portal:
  - http://somersetcountynj.justfoia.com/publicportal/home/newrequest
  - Public review must be conducted in a secure reading-room

## **New Business** Paul Malarcher

Health and Safety Officer is required to have copies of the RTK surveys in every facility required in Somerset County.

2024 YTD Somerset County Community Right-to-Know (CRTK) Surveys:

- Who must report:
  - Private industry, NAICS classifications listed at N.J.A.C. 7:1G-1.2, and "Produce, Use or Store":
    - >=EPCRA Section 302 Threshold Planning Quantity (TPQ) of Extremely Hazardous Substance, or
    - >=500 lbs of substance listed on NJ Environmental Hazardous Substance List, or
    - >=10,000 of any chemical for which OSHA requires a Safety Data Sheet
