# The Global and National Outlook 2010

We are undergoing fundamental social and economic shifts
Corporate layoffs - 9.7% National Unemployment
Foreclosures still persistent
Financial scandals have long term impacts
Extensive bail-out and rescue packages have a uncertain long-term impact
National health care reform has a uncertain long-term impact
But:
Worldwide economic downturn subsiding
Corporate Bankruptcies reduced
Banking, credit & housing markets stabilizing

# The State and Local Outlook 2010

- State and local governments will lag behind the general recovery
- State of New Jersey continues to deal with a financial crisis
- □ NJ Unemployment at 10.3%
- ☐ Somerset County unemployment at 8.1%
- Unprecedented cuts in state programs, services and state aid
- Municipal and school budgets all face reductions and tax increases

# **Impacts on Somerset County 2010**

- ☐ Real estate transfers up but \$ down
- ☐ Housing values still down
- ☐ Reassessments in 11 towns
- □ Interest on County investments still down
- □ Employment & real wages still down
- Demand for County human and social services up

### Somerset County Initiatives-What We've Done

- Somerset County has planned for a recessionary period
- Our long-term financial strategy planned for withstanding a 3-year economic downturn- 2010 is already into our fourth year.
- □ Wage freeze for no layoff policy, 12 of the 19 unions have agreed. Discussions are continuing with others.
- Change in health care providers & contributions from nearly all employees have lessened demand on budget
- ☐ Cease funding for EDIP
- ☐ Flexibility needed for 2011, CAP Bank is a priority

### Somerset County Initiatives-What We've Done - cont'd

- □ Increased 911 Dispatch and Health service coverage areas
- □ Increased Educational support to RVCC
- ☐ Saved additional \$517,000 over last year's vacant positions
- ☐ Saved an additional \$250,000 in fringe benefits by not filling these positions
- ☐ Met our objective of having a fiscally prudent 2010 County budget

# Highlights of the 2010 Budget

- □ Reduced revenue estimates by \$1,705,298
- ☐ Reduced usage of surplus by \$780,000
- ☐ Use half of \$35.5M surplus
- ☐ Retained \$18 million in surplus
- □ Total County budget is down 1.2 percent, or approx. \$2.5 million, from its 2009 level

- ☐ Maintain a no-tax increase budget without employing "one-time gimmicks" such as holding off on pension contributions; without compromising any future budgets; and without jeopardizing the county's two longtime triple-A bond ratings.
- ☐ Hiring freeze implemented only essential vacancies to be filled on an emergency basis.
- ☐ Several county offices and programs have reorganized or cross-trained staff in order to cover duties for vacancies that have not been filled.
- ☐ Overall, the county has decreased its personnel rolls by 5 percent since 2008.

- □ Wage freeze for all non-union employees and for union employees whose unions have agreed to the freeze; to date 12 of the county's 19 unions have accepted the salary freeze
- ☐ Continuation of the county's commitment since 2008 to decrease the workforce by attrition
- ☐ Elimination of the Municipal Youth Athletic/Recreation Grants program, for a savings of \$315,000 in capital funds
- ☐ Elimination of the Economic Development Incentive Program, for a savings of \$250,000

- ☐ Phase out the contract with Carrier Clinic to run the Richard Hall Community Mental Health Center, saving \$225,000; the county Department of Human Services has resumed direct oversight of the center
- ☐ Savings of more than \$100,000 in the Meals-on-Wheels program through competitive contracting
- □ We decreased the county's purchase-ofservices from nonprofits by reallocating to fund current priorities

- □ Downsize the Freeholders' and Administrator's office staffs by 25 percent in 2009 and 2010
- Cutting back overtime expenses and part-time hires since 2008
- Lower the cost of the county's health insurance by at least \$1 million by competitive contracting and switching providers, and requiring a higher level of employee contributions to the cost of the program
- ☐ Leveraging savings by implementing employee suggestions made at the beginning of 2009

- ☐ Annual number of meals served in Nutrition Program: 172,987 meals
- ☐ Start a mobile outreach/early intervention program to reduce commitments to state hospitals
- ☐ Maintain same number of ramps (17 per year) built by Handyman Program





Year-end surplus




